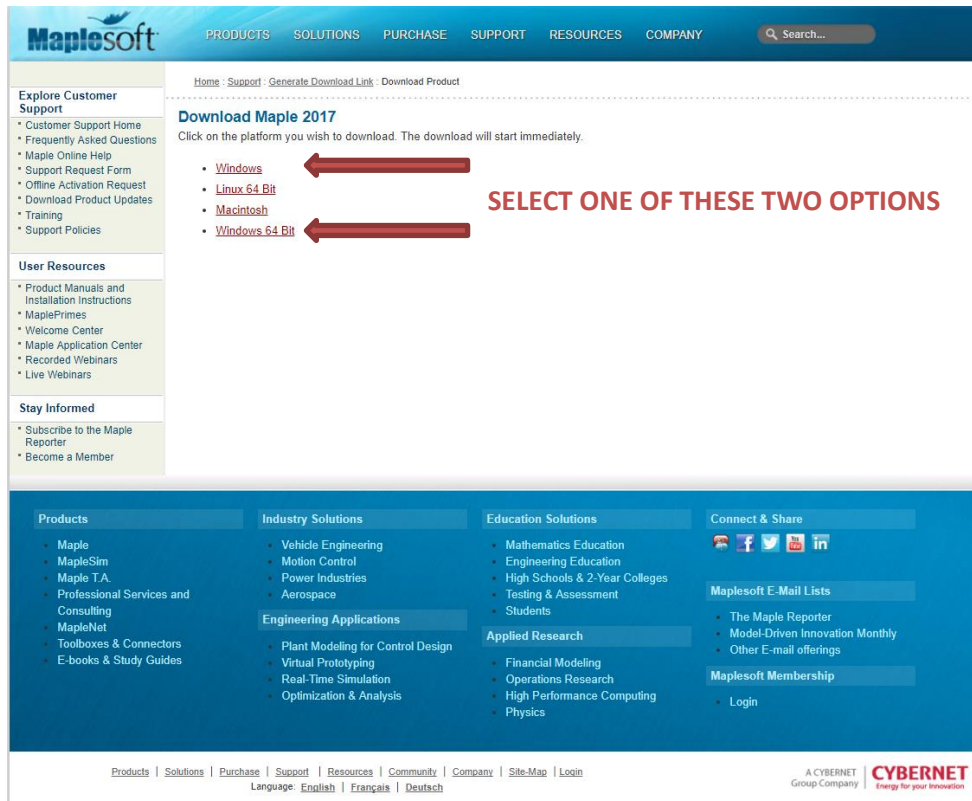

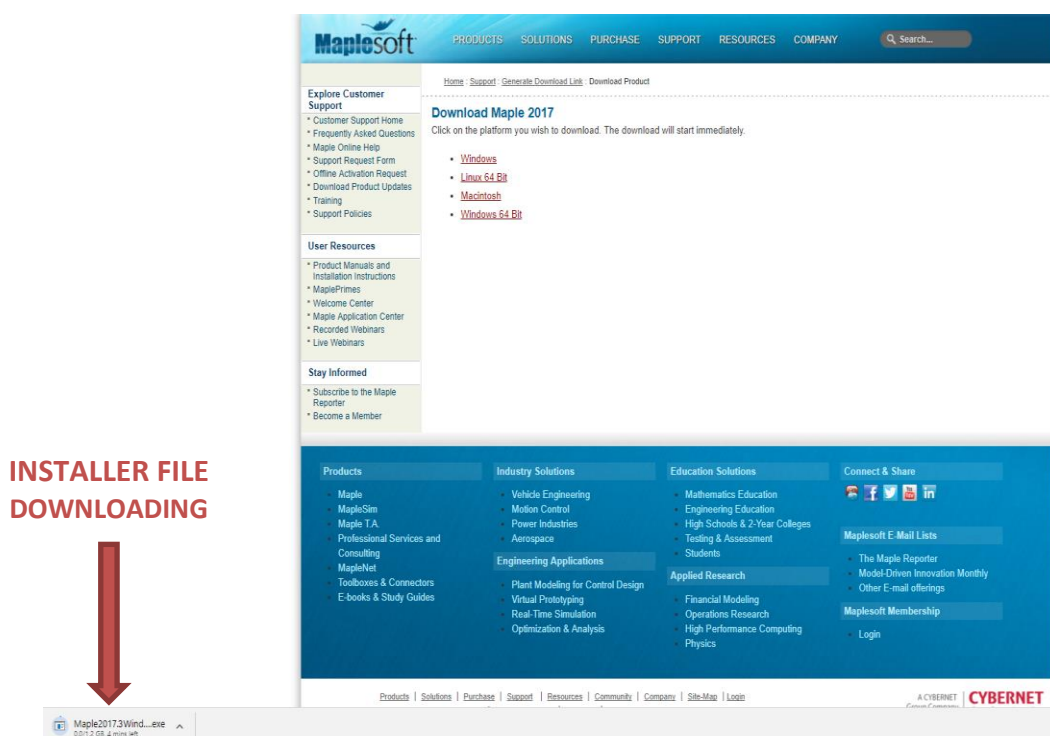

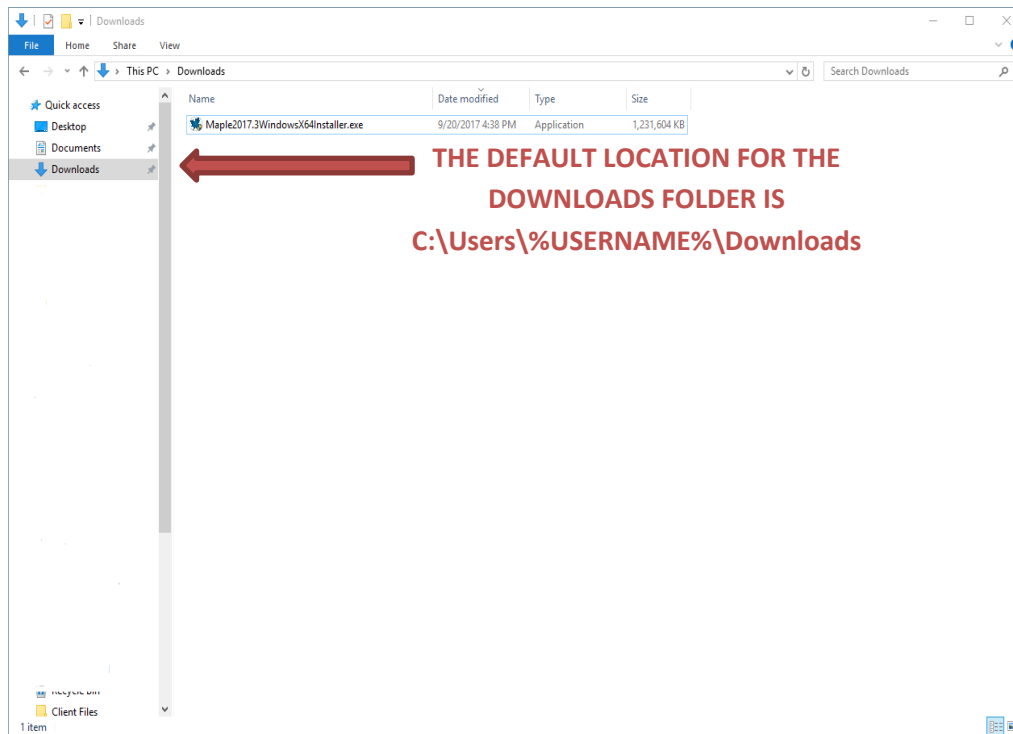

You will likely want to select “Windows 64-Bit” and you can check if your system is of this type by going to “Control Panel” > “System and Security” > “System” and view the “System type”:



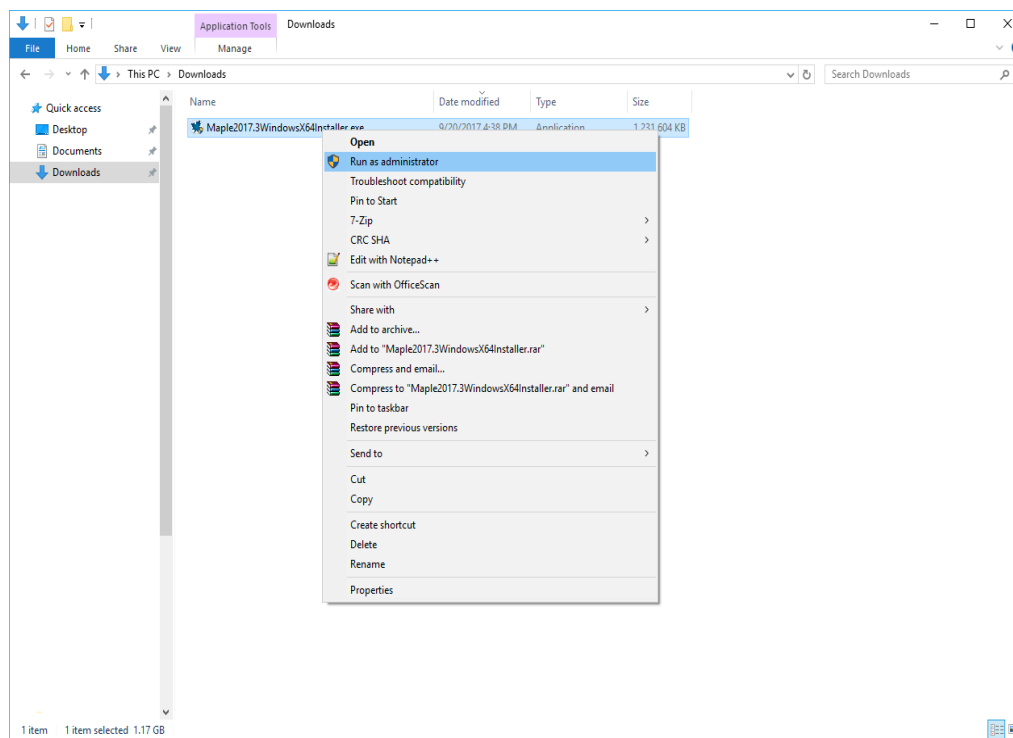

## NETWORK INSTALLATION - WINDOWS

### *INSTALL MAPLE NETWORK TOOLS ON SERVER MACHINE*

1. Get to the download page for Maple Network Tools 2017 from the bottom of this [webpage](#). Select “Windows” (32-bit) or “Windows 64-bit” to download the installer file.
2. Navigate to the “NetworkToolsWindowsX##Installer.exe” file. Right-click > “Run as Administrator”.
3. Navigate through the installer. You may change the default locations if necessary.

### *ACTIVATE MAPLE AND MAPLESIM EXPLORER NETWORK LICENSES*

1. On the server, navigate to the “activate” folder of your Maple Network Tools installation. By default, this is:  
`C:\Program Files\Maple Network Tools\activate`
2. Right-click “activation.exe” > “Run as Administrator”.
3. Input your “Maple for MapleSim Explorer” network “Purchase Code” and the “License server name”. If necessary, make a change to the “Port number” being used for the “Imgrd”. If you have a “Redundant server setup”, select “Yes” and view additional instructions [here](#).
4. A “MapleExplorer2017.lic” file will be created in the “activate” folder.
5. Right-click “activation.exe” > “Run as Administrator”.
6. Input your “MapleSim Explorer” network “Purchase Code” and the “License server name”. If necessary, make a change to the “Port number” being used for the “Imgrd” but keep it the same as above.
7. A “MapleSimExplorer2017.lic” file will be created in the “activate” folder.



## CONFIGURE LMTOOLS 11.13

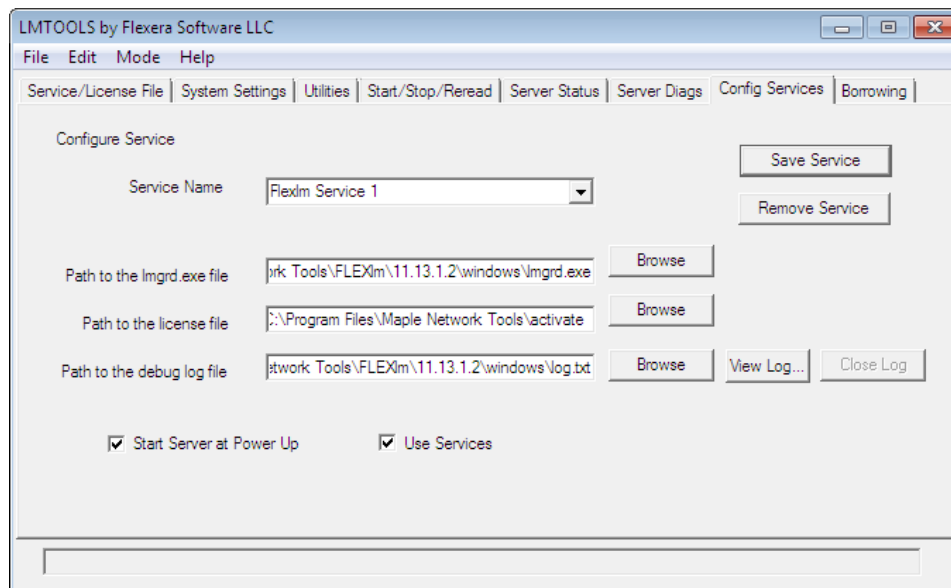
1. Open the license manager LMTools.
2. Navigate to the “Config Services” tab.
3. Redefine the “Path to the license file” to point at the entire directory containing the licenses. By default, the paths will be:

Path to the lmgrd.exe: C:\Program Files\Maple Network Tools\FLEXlm\11.13.1.2\windows\lmgrd.exe

Path to the license file: C:\Program Files\Maple Network Tools\activate

Path to the debug log file: C:\Program Files\Maple Network Tools\FLEXlm\11.13.1.2\windows\log.txt

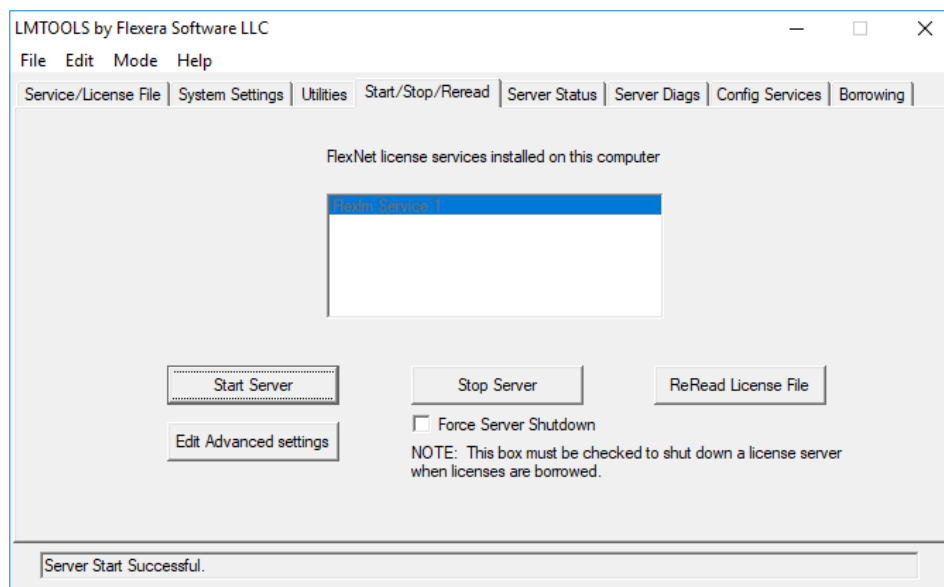
**Note:** Do not include a backslash after “activate”



4. Check “Use Services” and decide if you want to “Start Server at Power Up”.
5. Click “Save Service”.
6. Go to the “Start/Stop/Reread” tab.
7. Check the “Force Server Shutdown” checkbox and then click “Stop Server”.
8. In the bottom dialogue you will see “Stopping server”. Wait a few moments and then uncheck the “Force Server Shutdown” checkbox.

9. Click “Start Server”.

10. In the bottom dialogue you should now see “Server Start Successful”.



#### **INSTALL MAPLESIM AND ADD-ONS ON THE CLIENT MACHINE**

1. Run the Maple installer and proceed through the installation as normal. When prompted to “Choose the Type of Licensing”, select the “Network License” option.
2. Select “Single Server” or “Redundant Server” if you selected “Yes” for “Redundant server setup?” during the server machine activation.
3. Input the “License server” name and “Port number” to coincide with the port used for the “lmgrd” in the “MapleExplorer2017.lic” file.
4. Finish the installation.
5. A “license.dat” file will be created and the default location is:  
  
`C:\Program Files\Maple 2017\license\license.dat`
6. Run the MapleSim installer and proceed through the installation as normal. When prompted to “Choose the Type of Licensing”, select the “Use Network License Server” option.
7. When prompted between “MapleSim” and “MapleSim Explorer”, select “MapleSim Explorer”.

8. Select the components you would like to install. If you have any add-ons, ensure that you have kept them selected in the list. You are free to uncheck and thus not install any components that you do not require the components for. For all the components selected, an "<add-on>.dat" license file will be created in the corresponding add-on's "license" folder. By default, this is:

`C:\Program Files\Maple 2017\toolbox\<add-on>\license\`

9. Select "Single Server" or "Redundant Server" if you selected "Yes" for "Redundant server setup?" during the server machine activation.
10. Input the "License server" name and, if necessary, make a change to the "Port number" for the "lmgrd" connection.
11. Finish the installation.
12. Test MapleSim Explorer 2017 on the client machine.

## NETWORK INSTALLATION - MACINTOSH

### *INSTALL MAPLE NETWORK TOOLS ON SERVER MACHINE*

1. Get to the download page for Maple Network Tools 2017 from the bottom of this [webpage](#). Select “Macintosh” to download the installer file.
2. Navigate to the “NetworkToolsMacInstaller.dmg” file. Right-click > “Open”.
3. Right-click “NetworkToolsMacInstaller” > “Open”.
4. Navigate through the installer. You may change the default locations if necessary.

### *ACTIVATE MAPLE AND MAPLESIM EXPLORER NETWORK LICENSES*

1. On the server, navigate to the “activate” folder of your Maple Network Tools installation. By default, this is:  
`//Users/$USER/Applications/Maple Network Tools/activate`
2. Run “activation” which will launch the activation window.
3. Input your “Maple for MapleSim Explorer” network “Purchase Code” and the “License server name”. If necessary, make a change to the “Port number” being used for the “lmgrd”. If you have a “Redundant server setup”, select “Yes” and view additional instructions [here](#).
4. A “MapleExplorer2017.lic” file will be created in the “activate” folder.
5. Run “activation” which will launch the activation window again.
6. Input your “MapleSim Explorer” network “Purchase Code” and the “License server name”. If necessary, make a change to the “Port number” being used for the “lmgrd” but keep it the same as above.
7. A “MapleSimExplorer2017.lic” file will be created in the “activate” folder.

## START THE SERVER FOR THE FULL LICENSE DIRECTORY

Input the following into the Terminal:

```
cd <full path of the lmgrd folder>
./lmgrd -c <full path to the directory of license files> -l <full path to the debug log file> &
```

By default, this would be:

```
cd "//Users/$USER/Applications/Maple Network Tools/FLEXlm/11.13.1.2/"
./lmgrd -c "//Users/$USER/Applications/Maple Network Tools/activate/" -l
 "//Users/$USER/Applications/Maple Network Tools/FLEXlm/11.13.1.2/log.rtf" &
```

Note: You may need to make an empty file called "log.rtf" (or whatever name you prefer), save it to the Desktop and then move it into the above directory.

## TO STOP THE SERVER

Input the following into the Terminal:

```
cd <full path of the lmgrd folder>
./lmutil lmdown -q -c <full path to the network license file>
```

By default, this would be:

```
cd "//Users/$USER/Applications/Maple Network Tools/FLEXlm/11.13.1.2/"
./lmutil lmdown -q -c "//Users/$USER/Applications/Maple Network
Tools/activate/"
```

## INSTALL MAPLESIM AND ADD-ONS ON THE CLIENT MACHINE

1. Run the Maple installer and proceed through the installation as normal. When prompted to “Choose the Type of Licensing”, select the “Network License” option.
2. Select “Single Server” or “Redundant Server” if you selected “Yes” for “Redundant server setup?” during the server machine activation.
3. Input the “License server” name and “Port number” to coincide with the port used for the “lmgrd” in the “MapleExplorer2017.lic” file.
4. Finish the installation.
5. A “license.dat” file will be created and the default location is:  

```
//Library/Frameworks/Maple.framework/Versions/2017/license/license.dat
```
6. Run the MapleSim installer and proceed through the installation as normal. When prompted to “Choose the Type of Licensing”, select the “Use Network License Server” option.
7. When prompted between “MapleSim” and “MapleSim Explorer”, select “MapleSim Explorer”.
8. Select the components you would like to install. If you have any add-ons, ensure that you have kept them selected in the list. You are free to uncheck and thus not install any components that you do not require the components for. For all the components selected, an “<add-on>.dat” license file will be created in the corresponding add-on’s “license” folder. By default, this is:  

```
//Library/Frameworks/Maple.framework/Versions/2017/toolbox/<add-on>/license/
```
9. Select “Single Server” or “Redundant Server” if you selected “Yes” for “Redundant server setup?” during the server machine activation.
10. Input the “License server” name and, if necessary, make a change to the “Port number” for the “lmgrd” connection.
11. Finish the installation.
12. Test MapleSim Explorer 2017 on the client machine.

## NETWORK INSTALLATION - LINUX

### INSTALL MAPLE NETWORK TOOLS ON SERVER MACHINE

1. Get to the download page for Maple Network Tools 2017 from the bottom of this [webpage](#). Select “Linux 64-bit” to download the installer file.
2. Open the Terminal. Change the directory to the location where the installer file was downloaded to.
3. Execute the following:

```
chmod +x NetworkToolsLinuxX64Installer.run  
./NetworkToolsLinuxX64Installer.run
```

4. Proceed through the installation.

### ACTIVATE MAPLE AND MAPLESIM EXPLORER NETWORK LICENSES

1. On the server, open up the Terminal. Execute the following:

```
cd <path to the Maple Network Tools activate folder>  
./activation
```

By default, this is:

```
cd /home/$USER/MapleNetworkTools/activate  
./activation
```

2. Input your “Maple for MapleSim Explorer” network “Purchase Code” and the “License server name”. If necessary, make a change to the “Port number” being used for the “lmgrd”. If you have a “Redundant server setup”, select “Yes” and view additional instructions [here](#).
3. A “MapleExplorer2017.lic” file will be created in the “activate” folder.
4. Re-execute “./activation” which will launch the activation window again.
5. Input your “MapleSim Explorer” network “Purchase Code” and the “License server name”. If necessary, make a change to the “Port number” being used for the “lmgrd” but keep it the same as above
6. A “MapleSimExplorer2017.lic” file will be created in the “activate” folder.

## START THE SERVER FOR THE FULL LICENSE DIRECTORY

Input the following into the Terminal:

```
cd <full path of the lmgrd folder>

./lmgrd -c <full path to the directory of license files> -l <full path to
the debug log file> &
```

By default, this would be:

```
cd /home/$USER/MapleNetworkTools/FLEXlm/11.13.1.2

./lmgrd -c /home/$USER/MapleNetworkTools/activate/ -l
/home/$USER/MapleNetworkTools/FLEXlm/11.13.1.2/log.txt &
```

## TO STOP THE SERVER

Input the following into the Terminal:

```
cd <full path of the lmgrd folder>

./lmutil lmdown -q -c <full path to the network license file>
```

By default, this would be:

```
cd /home/$USER/MapleNetworkTools/FLEXlm/11.13.1.2

./lmutil lmdown -q -c /home/$USER/MapleNetworkTools/activate/
```

## INSTALL MAPLE AND MAPLESIM EXPLORER ON THE CLIENT MACHINE

1. Run the Maple installer and proceed through the installation as normal. When prompted to “Choose the Type of Licensing”, select the “Network License” option.
2. Select “Single Server” or “Redundant Server” if you selected “Yes” for “Redundant server setup?” during the server machine activation.
3. Input the “License server” name and “Port number” to coincide with the port used for the “lmgrd” in the “MapleExplorer2017.lic” file.
4. Finish the installation.



5. A "license.dat" file will be created and the default location is:

```
//home/$USER/maple2017/license/license.dat
```

6. Run the MapleSim installer and proceed through the installation as normal. When prompted to "Choose the Type of Licensing", select the "Use Network License Server" option.
7. When prompted between "MapleSim" and "MapleSim Explorer", select "MapleSim Explorer".
8. Select the components you would like to install. If you have any add-ons, ensure that you have kept them selected in the list. You are free to uncheck and thus not install any components that you do not require the components for. For all the components selected, an "<add-on>.dat" license file will be created in the corresponding add-on's "license" folder. By default, this is:  


```
//home/$USER/maple2017/toolbox/<add-on>/license/
```
9. Select "Single Server" or "Redundant Server" if you selected "Yes" for "Redundant server setup?" during the server machine activation.
10. Input the "License server" name(s) and, if necessary, make a change to the "Port number(s)" for the "Imgrd" connection.
11. Test MapleSim Explorer 2017 on the client machine.

## REDUNDANT SERVER SETUP

Follow the steps for your operating system with one small difference during the activation.

1. Enter in the appropriate “Purchase Code” for the component you are activating.
2. For “Redundant server setup?”, click “Yes”. This dialogue will appear:

3. Fill in the appropriate information for the three servers. After clicking “Ok” the “License server name”, “License server HostID” and “Port number” fields will populate and you can proceed with the activation like normal.

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# TROUBLESHOOTING

## COMMON ISSUES WITH MAPLE LICENSE SERVERS

- Server requires a stop/restart. Any changes to the network license file or the license manager requires that the service be stopped and then restarted.
- Mismatched Imgrd port numbers. The Imgrd port numbers in the client and server license files must be the same.
- Unspecified maplelmg port number. If this port number is omitted, a random port will be used, one which might be blocked or in use.
- Imgrd or maplelmg port numbers are closed or in use. The Imgrd port number, and the maplelmg port number if specified, must be opened in the firewall TCP/IP connections and unused elsewhere.
- Server names are mismatched. The server names in both the client and server license files must be the same, including case (capital and lowercase letters). Also, if the clients are on a different sub-network, the full server name needs to be specified.
- Multiple network license files. Older versions of server license files may conflict with the current version. This is because there would likely be multiple instances of the same "FEATURE" among the licenses.
- Multiple FLEXlm services. If there are multiple services of the same version of FLEXlm, they should be combined on the same instance. However, services of different versions of FLEXlm should be on separate machines.
- Improper Paths: One or more of the three paths in "Config Services" (for Windows) don't point to the proper file, or only specify a folder.
- Re-encryption of license file needed. If someone made a non-trivial change to the license file, but did not obtain/generate a new license file, the license will need to be stripped and re-encrypted.
- Loss of formatting for license file: Sometimes, after manually modifying a license file, the text editor will ruin the formatting. The license file will need to be regenerated.

## INVALID OR MISSING LICENSE FILE

1. This usually indicates that the server cannot pick up the license file because of a blocked connection.
2. Ensure that the port used for the "lmgrd.exe" in the "MapleSim2017.lic" file is opened in the firewall.
3. There is a second connection being made that by default is not explicitly stated. In your "MapleSim.lic" file you will see this line:

```
VENDOR maplelmg
```

You can change this to:

```
VENDOR maplelmg PORT=<port>
```

Where <port> is replaced by the port you desire for this connection and is different than the port being used for the "lmgrd.exe". This port will also have to be given the correct permissions for the firewall.

## INSTALLING 32-BIT COMPATIBILITY LIBRARIES

To install 32-bit compatibility libraries on 64-bit Linux, one or more of the following packages should be installed:

- lsb-core
- lsb-base
- ia32-libs
- libc6-i386
- glibc.i686

To install a package, you will need to execute a distribution-specific command at Terminal window with, obviously, "%package%" replaced by the package name:

Red Hat Linux, CentOS

```
sudo yum install %package%
```

Ubuntu

```
sudo apt-get install %package%
```

Debian

```
sudo rpm -i %package%
```
